





JUSTICE, NOT CHARITY: HOW TO END HUNGER

At any given time, nearly 1 in 8 of our neighbors in Allegheny County are facing chronic hunger, and 1 in 13 face food insecurity. These low-income families, seniors, and people with disabilities don't know whether they'll be able to afford their next meal. Aside from the immeasurable moral costs of hunger in human suffering and indignity, hunger takes a quantifiable toll on public health, education outcomes, and our economy – totalling around \$3.25 billion/year in Pennsylvania.

ADDRESSING HUNGER AT ITS ROOT

Just Harvest reduces hunger, not by handing out food, but by lifting up those in need. We get at the root causes of food insecurity by leveraging public policies and programs to reduce poverty and improve food access for individuals and communities.
